2009 was marked by two important projects

- 1. The production of a documentary film in which the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation was involved as co-producer and Daniela Ambrosoli as director.
- 2. The film, entitled "HN Hermann Nitsch", describes the life and the man Hermann Nitsch, founder of Viennese Actionism. The film was shot in Italy, Austria and Rumania.
- 3. The second project was a novel, "Oltre Gottardo"- Over the Mountain A double portrait "La Lupa and Daniela Ambrosoli". It was written by Silvana Schmid and tells the story of the famous Ticino singer "La Lupa" and that of Daniela Ambrosoli.

Classical dance

Zaloa Fabbrini, *1990, Italy

Scholarship holder 2006-2009, concludes her three-year study programme with her Diploma as a stage dancer, as well as graduating from High School at the National Ballet School Toronto. At the school Spring Show Case, Zaloa dances in excerpts from "Swan Lake" (4 little swans) arranged by Marius Petipa and Lev Ivanov, and also in excerpts from "Sequentia", choreography Sabrina Matthews. In summer Zaloa attends the famous Victor Ullate's school in Madrid. Zaloa is currently dancing with the Italian company MaggioDanza, Florence, under the direction of Vladimir Derevianko.

Antonella Martinelli, *1987, Argentina

Scholarship holder 2003-2006, concludes her second dance contract at the National Ballet of Canada as member of the corps de ballet of this company and extends it for the 2009-2010 season. She dances in the ballets of the "Nutcracker Suite", "Symphony in C", "Romeo and Juliet" and "Giselle", as well as in the world premiere of Crystal Pite's "Emergence" and in the company premiere of John Neumeier's "The Seagull" and David Bombana's "Carmen".

Ilana Werner, *1983, Switzerland

Scholarship holder 1997-1999, dancing since 2005 at the Bavarian State Ballet. In 2009 Ilana dances the leading role in the ballet "Romeo and Juliet" in the famous choreography of John Cranko and is hugely successful in this and in many other roles sharing the solo work.

Lucia Solari, *1982, Italy

Scholarship holder 2000-2002, dancing since 2005 at the John Neumeier Hamburg Ballet. For the 2009-2010 season, Lucia is nominated soloist at the Nijinsky-Gala of the Hamburg Ballet. Her roles include that of Effie in "La Sylphide" (P. Lacotte/F.Taglioni) and also the role of Kalliope in the new creation of Orpheus in 2009.



Contemporary dance

Matthew Bade, *1990, U.S.A.

Scholarship holder 2009-2010, born in Wisconsin. The family lives in the South of France, Virginia, New York, Texas and Portland, Oregon. There he attends a public school for the arts, where dance is an obligatory subject. He goes on to take additional private classes with older students. 2004 marks a significant turning point when he auditions for the high school company The Jefferson Dancers, with whom he performs in several shows. Between 2004 and 2008, Matt works with renowned choreographers in this company and tours Europe as a dancer with them. At the same time he is also successful in his High School and College studies. In 2008, Matt auditions at the CODARTS, Rotterdam, and is awarded a place to continue his training in contemporary dance. For the school year 2009-2010, Matt has received a scholarship from the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation for the second year of a four-year course.

Naima Sommacal, *1989, Switzerland

Scholarship holder 2009-2010, is in the second year of her dance studies at the Rotterdam Dance Academy, where her aim is to gain a Bachelor of Dance Diploma. In 1996, Naima begins classes in children's dancing with Luzia Burgdorfer then moves on to the Daisy Olgiati Ballet School in Zollikon/Zurich. In 2001, she studies at the Swiss Professional Ballet School, the SBBS, in Zurich and from 2004 to 2007 continues her training at the Scuola di Danza del Teatro dell'Opera in Rome. In 2008 Naima takes part in the ninth Swiss audition of the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation for the Rotterdam Dance Academy. For the school year 2009-2010, Naima has received a scholarship from the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation for the second year of a four-year course.

Maya Roest, *1988, Belgium

Scholarship holder 2007-2009, completes her training at the Rotterdam Dance Academy with a Bachelor of Dance Diploma and has been given a contract for the 2009-2010 season as a dancer with the famous Scapino Ballet in Rotterdam.

Michele Mastroianni, *1988, Italy

Scholarship holder 2007-2009, has been engaged for the 2009-2010 season with the Nanine Linning Dance company at the Staatstheater Osnabrück.

Salvatore Leocata, *1986, Italy

Scholarship holder 2008-2010, dances in the CODARTS show "Talent on the Move" in 2009. In the fourth and final year of his training at the Rotterdam Dance Academy, 2009-2010, he is offered an engagement with the Itzik Galili Company in Amsterdam. The Company is currently touring Holland with "The Casualties of Memories". Salvatore has been awarded his second scholarship by the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation.



Aristide Rontini, *1984, Italy

Scholarship holder 2007-2010, performs in the CODARTS show "Talent on the Move" in 2009. In the fourth year of his training at the Rotterdam Dance Academy, he is engaged by Conny Janssen in Rotterdam and performs in more than 35 shows all over Holland in the choreography Ruis. Aristide has been awarded his third scholarship by the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation.

Giacomo Corvaia, *1984, Italy

Scholarship holder 2008-2009, completes his studies with the D.A.N.C.E. Diploma of the Palucca School in Dresden. In 2007-2009 he successfully presents his own choreography in Parma, Dresden, Marseilles, Aix-en-Provence and Charleroi. Giacomo is selected to do the choreography of William Forsythe's "Hypothetical Stream" for the final-year performance in the famous Semper Opera in Dresden. His first engagement is with the Staatstheater Kassel for the 2009-2010 season.

Laia Sanmartin, *1982, Spain

Scholarship holder 2009-2010, born in Barcelona. Her artistic career begins in street theatre. Her desire to learn more about theatre technique leads her to the El Timbal theatre school in Barcelona from 2002-2004. The Scuola Teatro Dimitri in Verscio/Tessin provides her with the training she was seeking in Movement Theatre. It is there in 2008 that she gains her Bachelor of Arts in Physical Theatre, and in 2010 her Master's degree at the Master's Campus Theatre. Laia has been awarded a scholarship for the school year 2009-2010 by the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation.

Annakatrin Trautmann, *1982, Germany

Scholarship holder 2009-2010, Annakatrin was born in Dresden, does her Abitur (School-leaving certificate) at the Schadow Gymnasium in Berlin. 2003-2005 she takes the Preliminary diploma in Drama at the University of Hildesheim. In 2008 she gains her Bachelor of Arts degree in physical theatre at the Scuola Teatro Dimitri in Verscio/Tessin and in 2010 goes on to take her Master's degree there at the Master-Campus Theater CH. Annakatrin has been awarded a scholarship for the school year 2009-2010 by the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation.

David Melcarne, *1981, Italy/Switzerland

Scholarship holder 2007-2009, successfully completes his third year of training with a Diploma at the Paola Grassi Scuola D'Arte Drammatica in Milan. Until November, David remains a member of the school's Dance company. They have various performances planned in Milan, Turin and other Italian cities. At the end of the year David leaves the company to take up new challenges, one example being studying with Ismael Ivo in Venice or going to Florence to audition for Virgilio Sieni.



Jasmine Morand, *1977, Switzerland

Scholarship holder 1993-1994 and 2000-2002, gives performances with the new choreography Aquarium of her dance company Prototype Status and in collaboration with the Reverse Engineering Group in Winterthur and Siders/Sierre.

Duo Zimmermann & de Perrot

grew out of the Trio Metzger-Zimmermann-de Perrot. They were awarded the Swiss Choreography prize by the Corymbo Foundation at a Gala performance of their work "Gaffaff" in Berne. Daniela Maracci Ambrosoli is a patron member. In 1999 the Pierino Ambrosoli Foundation supports the Trio in their production "Gopf" and in 2004 in their production "Janei".

Music

Karolina Öhman, Cellist, *1985, Sweden

Scholarship holder 2008-2010, continues her studies at the Zurich University of the Arts and in the solo diploma concert gives an excellent performance of the famous Cello Concerto by Robert Schumann, op.129 with the Zurich Academic Orchestra in Zug and Zurich. In December, Karolina wins second prize in a Cello competition for new music in Stuttgart. She is currently working on her Master of Arts degree in music at the Zurich University of the Arts.

Fulvia Mancini, Cellist, *1981, Italy

Scholarship holder 2008-2009, studies Cello and Pedagogics at the Berne University of the Arts, with the aim of gaining a Master of Arts degree in Music Pedagogics. Fulvia is in her third semester (school year 2009-2010) at the Berne University of the Arts.

Mattia Zappa, Cellist, *1973, Switzerland

Scholarship holder 1994-1995, organises the Soweto Project with the pianist Massimiliano Mainolfi. The Zappa/Mainolfi Duo performs a charity concert in November 2009 in New York's famous Carnegie Hall which enables poor children to attend the Melody Music School of Soweto.
